A Job Worth Doing?

The worst part of the job is not the work itself, but some community members' attitude towards an occupation of beautician: some do think this work is very bad and a wrong thing to do. One might imply "why are you learning parlouring only? You should go for something else." Payal and Hemleta have encountered such an attitude mainly from other women. Men sem to have no opinion on the matter. Payal and Hemleta feel it to be narrowminded thinking. They wonder if these women are

jealous about their possibility to go out and work. As the sisters wish to do – to obtain some independency and hunger for freedom, to have possibility to make choices on life of their own.

The two sisters had fun together in the training and are keeping up the habit now as co-workers. Who knows, if they will form together a parlour of their own full of joy and cheerfulness, as well as some facial treatment, head massage, makep-up art et cetera...
