

Customers and Gains

In this unisex-parlour Abhijee has two coworkers: his brother-in-law and one employee. The Facebook-saloon is three months old and doing great! The parlour has had a great success and now they have 30 to 40 customers in an usual day.

After all the expenses, parlour profits about Rs. 30 000 per a month. A sum, which Abhijee shares with his brother-in-law equally. The one employee who is working in the saloon receives salary of Rs. 7 000 per a month.

In this amount of customers and salary Abhijee is very satisfied with. He uses the salary for household use, savings and a part he invests to the parlour. In the family the father makes the decisions how the money is spent among



household uses. His father also tells Abhijee that he can save the money for the parlour if he wants to.

From Enjoying to Earning

Both of Abhijee's parents feel very good about their son's working. Before Abhijee was only helping in his father's farm and enjoying life, but now he is earning livelihood and taking responsibility.

Besides Abhijee's earnings, in the family there are only father's earnings from the farm – which may vary, depending on how the crops do each season. No wonder incomes from the parlour had a good improvement on the family's economy.

In the saloon they give their customers a professional advice what they can offer. And the customers usually do come back to hear their advices again and to purchase saloon's services.

During *i*LEAD Abhijee found out his own aim: one should work for himself, rather than depend on and work for somebody else. After 10th grade he was just working in his father's farm and enjoying life. Then Abhijee heard about the *i*LEAD from his brother-in-law, who had been to the training. Through him, Abhijee knew a little bit about the work of parlour in beforehand.

The saloon is open from 9am to 9pm. During a week there is no closing – the parlour is open seven days a week. For now Abhijee feels it hasn't been too much of work and he tries to meet his friends after work. Parlour's neighbours have felt that there is not too much males in this field – and so Abhijee is doing something new, which is a good matter.

On society, Abhijee feels that what men are capable of doing, so are women as well – and vice versa. Although, now this isn't applying to everywhere in India, it should be there. And it will be there. If Abhijee could help the people, then the first thing he would do is provide education to poor people and teach them how to read and write. After *i*LEAD Abhijee has participated *i*LEAD to promote the training in CMD; Community Mobilization Drive. He has also been telling his friends about the *i*LEAD. Abhijee wishes to teach in the future people more about beauty matters and make peeople more aware of beauty issues.
