in one's own company

Bright sunlight warms minor streets in the city of Pune. Within one of its communities, odor of petrol senses to nose. Behind the corner two women are working on a two-wheeler and just opening its cover's screws. Not a long time and inner parts come to light and the engine's air-filter is uncovered. The two determinated women, Sonal and Neeha, go on cleaning the filter. Is it easy as that to start a business in automobile repairing, where a woman worker is rareness?

Why Not a Beautician?

Sonal and Neeha's families were not very convenient hearing about their daughters' interest in to participate the automobiles training. So Sonal was recommended to take part in IT and Neeha to attend beautician course. It took a week for Sonal to assure her parents participating IT just wouldn't work, as her interest lies on automobiles. As well, Neeha wanted to choose automobiles out of curiosity – as women are not common in this field she wanted to satisfy her curiosity.

Now both of the families feel very happy and are proud of their daughters — the company owners in their very own repair workshop. Neeha's mother even adds she feels very proud of her daughter, as she is doing something different from the others. "She is brave" the mother says.

Nilesh Automobiles

Neeha and Sonal took part in the same *i*LEAD batch, where they became friends. Just two months had passed after *i*LEAD, when Sonal formed the company by herself. Neeha had a bit of hesitation on forming business of her own, so she worked eight months in another company. Then she joined to Nilesh Automobiles as co-owner. Now Nilesh Automobiles is a eight-month-old business and the owners feel good from the work they're doing.

The company was named after Sonal's died brother. Nowadays, usually there are three to four customers in a day, which is nice the entepreuners think. Now they earn around Rs. 6 000 per month. All the earnings they share equally between each other. Both of them feel good they are earning the salary by their own work. Sonal also goes to another evening-work for three hours per day, where she receives Rs. 2 500 per month.

Both of the Nilesh Automobiles entepreuners give the salary to their families. Although, they do keep themselves a small part for minor expences of their own. Sonal uses the money to buy some cosmetics et cetera, while Neeha saves part of the money for the future to a bank. Both of them consult their mothers where to use the money, as the mothers think it's a good practise so the girls won't misuse the money.

Independency in Schedules - When You Decide Them by Yourself

Formerly Neeha was working in a sparepart showroom just after *i*LEAD. Now, after giving up her job she feels it was a good choice. The other job was too far away and the working hours were from 9 am to 6 pm for not-a-good salary. While at Nilesh Automobiles, time to time she has some time to concenrate on her final 12th grade examinations on the afternoons. Besides, "as enterpreuner one can

make up the schedule by yourself" Sonal adds.

The repair workshop is open about four hours per a day. Besides repairing two-wheelers and running the company, the both help their families in household-work before leaving to work in the morning.

The best is automobiles

For both of the automobile girls working with two-wheelers is the best part of the job. As there are different challenges and items to be repaired, one learns a lot of new while repairing different kind of problems. Although, customers might be tricky and not always everyone is happy – but they have managed to handle such situations as well.

So far, repairing of the engine has been the hardest task to do. Though, the engine repairs they have done, the customers have been happy with the work they have done. As for Neeha and Sonal it doesn't matter whose two-wheeler they're working on, the repair workshop receives customers from both genders.

From Being Afraid to Braveness

The most essential part for them in *i*LEAD the both mention Personality Development training. Besides, it was the *i*LEAD's applitude test that supported Seena's view to go for automobiles.

During *i*LEAD Seena and Sonal gained empowerment within themselves to go on reaching their dreams and goals. "Before I was afraid of going out of the home freely", the both admit. "I was just sitting home" Sonal says. They say today they have let go of such state of afraidness and are now free and indepent to make their own decision.
